
TOGETHER WE CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Our mission is to change this one person, community, nation at a time. You can help!





J.R. Bucklew serves as the Director of Development for Sign Language projects on the Pioneer Bible Translators Development team. The first ever Sign Language Bible has been completed. A project spanning decades is finally here. Now, of more than 400 known sign languages world-wide, there is ONE complete Bible in sign language. The ASLV (American Sign Language

1ST EVER FULL SIGN LANGUAGE BIBLE

Imagine being forced to read, understand, and apply the Bible and all of its truths in a language you don't speak and may not be fluent in. Imagine someone telling you that the Word of God is not available in your 1st language.

This has been the case for so many Deaf individuals around the world. There has not been a single available full bible translation for any sign language until mid 2020. To

date, there are more than 400 known sign languages and now there is one full translation. This ground breaking project completion will provide access to Deaf in America.

Why is this such a huge vices, tablets, and achievement? Sign language is not a written or "spoken" time, has made the language. Due to technology, this version is widely accessible through commonly used platforms such as mobile devices, tablets, and computer computers This, for the first time, has made the Word of God available to more people in the Deaf community more than ever before.

Traditionally, the Bible has been dependant on individual sign language interpreters for translation and interpretation. Many interpreters may or may not have a deep enough theological understanding of meaning and context of portions of the Bible to effectively and accurately convey the message. More over, there are many instances where a non-believing interpreter is used to rendering the Bible and its meaning to the Deaf. This practice can pave the way for huge variances or flat out incorrect interpretations of scripture. With the ASLV (American Sign Language Version), there is now more of a standard in target language rendering. In other terms, each time someone sees the same verse it is presented more consistently leading to greater understanding of Christian concepts found in the Bible.

The ASLV project has been decades in the making with cooperation of several translation organizations. This successful model is being emulated worldwide to bring the gospel truth to every tribe and tongue.

Love - something like food or activity


Love - love for a person

Anyone can learn to use sign language to communicate. Don't be afraid... there are so many people willing to help you along in your journey.




An easy way to remember the sign for 'Jesus' our LORD and savior... use your middle finger to touch the palm where Jesus uas pierced at crusifiction.
